General Information About Colombia

As the host country of the JamCam, we want to extend a special welcome to Colombia a place known for its warmth, cultural richness, and extraordinary biodiversity. Colombia is the second most biodiverse country in the world, home to an incredible variety of birds, plants, amphibians, mammals, and ecosystems that range from tropical rainforests and vast plains to majestic mountain ranges and unique páramos.

Each region brings its own colours, flavours, and traditions, making Colombia a diverse and vibrant destination full of life.



What do I need to enter Colombia?

All travellers must present a valid passport upon arrival. Depending on your nationality, a visa may be required, so we encourage you to verify this in advance. It is also important to have a return ticket or proof of onward travel.

Before travelling, you must complete the Check-Mig form online. This is a mandatory requirement that facilitates migration controls and speeds up the entry process into the country. We recommend filling it out ahead of time and ensuring that all information is correct.



How does currency work in Colombia?

The official currency in Colombia is the Colombian peso (COP). Banknotes come in denominations of 2,000, 5,000, 10,000, 20,000, 50,000, and 100,000 pesos, and there are coins of various values as well. In Cali, you will be able to use credit and debit cards in most establishments and within Comfandi. However, we always recommend carrying some cash for small expenses or for places that may not accept electronic payments.

The exchange rate varies daily, so it is advisable to check the current rate before exchanging money. At airports, banks, and shopping centres, you will find authorized exchange offices; for safety and reliability, we encourage you to use only official locations.

SiScout

SiScout is the official platform of the JamCam and will be one of the most important tools for all participants, accompanying adults, and members of the International Service Team.

Through this system, all essential event information is managed from registrations and insurance to assignments and access control ensuring an organized and safe experience for everyone.

Usernames and passwords have already been sent by email. We kindly invite you to check your inbox and log in to the platform to verify that your information is complete and up to date.

In addition, all participants must download the SiScout app, available to everyone. This app will not only simplify the processes leading up to the event, but it will also serve as the main communication channel throughout the entire JamCam.

Through the app, you will be able to:

- Update your personal information.
- Complete and keep your medical form up to date.
- Connect with other participants and make new friends.
- Share posts and capture moments from the event.
- Access official JamCam news and updates.
- Check the updated activity schedule.
- Review bulletins and other informational documents.

The app will be used throughout the entire event, so it is essential to install it before travelling.

Arrival to the adventure and your journey back home

- To arrive at the event in the city of Cali, you may take a direct flight to Alfonso Bonilla Aragón Airport, or travel with connections through cities such as Bogotá or Medellín. If a direct flight is not available, you can first travel to one of these cities and then continue to Cali by land transportation.
- Once in Cali, the event will provide transportation from the airport to the Comfandi Pance Recreational Centre. It is very important that you share your travel itinerary with us through your Contingent Leader. This applies to all JamCam participants and to members of the International Service Team.
- Please note that entry to the event will take place on 27 December for youth participants and accompanying adults, and on 26 December for the International Service Team. Early arrivals will not be permitted. All arrival procedures will be coordinated directly with each Contingent Leader.
- If you arrive in Cali by land, please go directly to the Comfandi Centre to complete your event registration.
- If you arrive earlier than the official dates, we recommend organising your transportation to the Comfandi Centre independently or with your group.
- Your country's Contingent Leader and their CMT will be responsible for collecting the event kits. Each contingent will manage the internal distribution of these materials.
- For your return, the event will provide transportation between the event site and the airport.
If you are travelling back by land or departing after the official closing date, your contingent will be responsible for making the necessary arrangements.

JamCam General Information

Will there be internet access?

Yes, the camp will provide internet access for all participants. However, we encourage you to use connectivity mindfully and in balance. Remember that the JamCam is a unique opportunity to create memorable experiences, connect with Scouts from across the Americas, and enjoy living together in community. We invite you to make the most of every moment and prioritise personal connections over digital ones.

Will there be charging points?

Yes, all participants will have access to charging stations exclusively for power banks. These stations will be managed within each subcamp. To use this service, you must hand in your power bank along with its charging cable at the designated point in your subcamp, where it will be charged and later returned to you.



Important: Only power banks with their corresponding cables will be accepted. Direct charging of mobile devices or other electronic equipment will not be permitted.

Can I leave the camp on my own?

No. For safety and responsibility reasons, no participant may leave the camp on their own. This rule applies to everyone without exception: youth participants, accompanying adults, International Service Team (IST) members, and staff. All departures must be authorized and coordinated by the event's organizing team.

Interamerican Scout Complex

The heart of the JamCam! A place to explore, learn, and connect with young Scouts and organizations from across the continent. Here, you will discover how many are working every day to build a better world.

Interamerican Development Village

Discover incredible projects that are making a real difference. Visit the stands, take part in the Rally, and explore how you can become a leader and an agent of positive change within your community.

Interamerican Scout Centre

Take a trip across the Americas without leaving the camp. Each country will showcase the best of its culture, flavors, and traditions. Come to enjoy, learn, and celebrate our diversity!

Faith Village

A space for dialogue, reflection, and mutual respect among different beliefs. Join activities that invite you to share your values, learn from others, and build together a message of peace and empathy.

Peace-Art

The cultural city of the JamCam — where art and creativity come together to build peace. Here you can dance, sing, paint, write, and express your talents while celebrating the beauty and diversity of the Americas.

Empathy Workshops

Take part in a unique experience: you will represent leaders from different belief systems and work together to solve a social challenge. Listen, understand, and seek solutions through respect and empathy. You'll discover that we are more alike than we think!



Empathy Block

Seeing with the Heart

This programme block invites us to look beyond what our eyes can see, to listen beyond the noise, and to feel beyond ourselves. Empathy becomes the compass guiding each experience, reminding us that every person, culture, and reality carries unique value.

Through games, challenges, stories, and shared moments, participants will learn that understanding others is not only about stepping into their shoes it is about opening the eyes of the heart.

► Different Perspectives

An invitation to step outside your own viewpoint and explore the world from different angles. Through creative challenges, role-playing, and real-life scenarios, you'll discover that there is no single way to understand reality. When we learn to see with empathy, we grow in respect, understanding, and appreciation of diversity.

► Goalball:

In this sport, sight takes a break and your senses of hearing, touch, and teamwork take the lead. It is an inclusive, full-body experience where every throw and every block is felt rather than seen.



Can you trust your team when you cannot see?

Solidarity Block

(Off-site Programme)

Serving with the Heart

This solidarity programme block reminds us that true strength emerges when we act together — when we offer our hands, time, and energy in service to others. Here, participants will experience the Scout spirit at its fullest: serving without expecting anything in return, building community, and leaving the world a little better than we found it.

Through various service journeys in Cali and its surrounding areas, young people at JamCam 2025 will engage with environmental, social, educational, and community initiatives that promote care for life, equity, and hope. Each action is designed to create positive impact, strengthen local and global partnerships, and reaffirm our commitment to the Sustainable Development Goals.

Service Projects

► JamCam in Aguacatal (Childhood)

A cultural exchange and community beautification experience in partnership with the “Regalando Sonrisas” project of Scout Group 823.

► Lazarolandia (Animals)

A journey of empathy and care for animals, promoting environmental awareness and respect for all living beings.

► Boomker Social (Social Development)

Support for people in vulnerable situations through community-driven actions and shared service.

► Felipe Torres Legarreta Nursery, JamCam in Pance & Botanical Garden (Environmental)

Activities focused on ecosystem restoration, tree planting, and fostering shared responsibility for the planet.

► María Perlaza Educational Institution (Social Development)

Participants will support the organization and implementation of the school's end-of-year bazaar, accompanying students and visitors in a day filled with service, joy, and teamwork.

In each of these spaces, Scouts will put into practice the values that define us: helping others, cooperation, respect, and global brotherhood. Because when we serve together, we show that solidarity has no borders and that every gesture, no matter how small, can be the beginning of meaningful change.



Block of Cooperation

Flying together takes us farther

In nature, as in life, we only grow stronger when we learn to coordinate our efforts, share resources, and trust one another. When cooperation takes flight, communities become resilient and capable of achieving what no individual could accomplish alone.

In this block, adventure becomes a metaphor for shared flight: every challenge from the ground to the water invites participants to discover that unity and collaboration are the keys to overcoming any obstacle.

Through action-based, skill-focused and teamwork-driven activities, participants will put cooperation into practice while facing challenges inspired by the world of birds:

► Flight in Flock

A coordination and decision-making game involving the use of the canopy. Like birds aligning in mid-air, each movement depends on collective rhythm and trust.

► Ani Flock

A physical-skill activity that invites participants to work together and overcome small challenges. This experience includes a circuit of elevated ropes, echoing how birds rely on their group to stay balanced.

► Birds' Race

A challenge that tests creativity and teamwork, reminding us that in nature no species survives alone.

► Dive into Biodiversity

Water-based games that encourage adaptation, coordination, and shared fun, inspired by the way birds move between water and air.

► Solidarity Match

Together, participants overcome obstacles on their way to “The Great Parliament of Wings,” where every individual achievement contributes to a collective purpose.



Freedom Block

(outside the camp area)

Discover, explore, and soar high

These activities, framed around the value of freedom, remind us that exploring new horizons is also a way to grow. To fly is not only to move from one place to another, but to open your mind, marvel at diversity, and recognize that the world is full of stories waiting to be discovered.

In this block, Borondos and Calidosos are flight paths inviting participants to look beyond the camp, connect with the territory, its people and its culture, and understand that freedom is best lived when shared with respect and responsibility.

Borondos – Camporee

The Borondos are excursions designed for younger participants to explore Cali's biodiversity, culture, and science through a playful and educational lens. Each route whether through animals, art, history, or nature is an adventure in learning by doing, where every step strengthens curiosity, observation, and love for the environment.

From the trails of the Zoo and the Cali River to cultural, sports and science routes across the city, the Borondos connect participants with their surroundings, awakening environmental awareness and the spirit of exploration that characterizes the Scout Movement.

Borondo 1, Las Gatas Del Rio Camporee:

Held in the heart of Cali along the banks of the Cali River, this experience combines a cultural tour of iconic sculptures—such as the Gato de Tejada— and a visit to the Hernando Tejada Museum, with an ecological walk that invites environmental observation and reflection.

Framed within the JAMCAM 2025 biodiversity focus, this route allows participants to discover the richness of urban birdlife that inhabits the riverside ecosystem, highlighting the value of nature within the city and the role of Scouts as active observers and guardians of the places they explore.



Borondo 2 – Camporee: Roots and Traditions

This activity unfolds in the historic and cultural heart of Cali, a city renowned for its heritage, joyful spirit, and identity shaped by salsa, urban art, and popular traditions. Through a guided walk across emblematic points in the city center, Scouts will experience an urban exploration that blends play, observation, teamwork, and direct contact with history, art, and local culture.

This route seeks to strengthen curiosity, a sense of belonging, and respect for heritage, allowing every participant to connect with the soul of the city in a meaningful and playful way.



Borondo 3 – Camporee: Art and Creativity

This activity is part of an experiential learning journey designed for Scouts to discover and appreciate Cali's cultural heritage. Through a guided walk across three emblematic sites—the Casa de los Títeres (Puppet House), the Loma de la Cruz Artisanal Park, and San Antonio Church—participants immerse themselves in the artistic, historical, and traditional expressions of the region.

Borondo 4 – Camporee: Science in Action

This route takes place in an educational, cultural, and scientific environment within the city of Cali, visiting key spaces such as the Jorge Garcés Borrero Departmental Library, the Federico Carlos Lehmann Valencia Museum of Natural Sciences, the MIVO Interactive Museum, and the Astronomical Observatory.

These settings offer rich, hands-on learning environments where young Scouts connect with regional biodiversity, the universe, and creative exploration through immersive, playful, and participatory activities.

The experience aims to strengthen the connection with the territory, foster scientific thinking, and spark imagination through an integral approach that combines nature, science, art, and culture.

Borondo 5 – Camporee: Cali Pachanguero

Internationally known as the World Capital of Salsa, Cali becomes the stage for a borondo that brings together music, history, and identity. In iconic spaces such as Barrio Obrero, the Jairo Varela Square, and the Jairo Varela Museum, participants will experience salsa as an intangible cultural heritage, exploring its popular origins, styles, rhythms and key figures.

This vibrant setting offers a sensory experience that blends body expression, creativity, and local pride, strengthening the connection between Scouts and the cultural richness of the territory.

Borondo 6 – Camporee: Sports Challenge

This activity takes place in Cali's urban sports environment, known as the Sports Capital of the Americas. The route includes emblematic places such as the Pascual Guerrero Olympic Stadium, the Alberto Galindo Pools, and the Parque del Perro.

These spaces provide a dynamic and enriching environment where participants can enjoy outdoor recreational and sports experiences that promote teamwork, sports culture, and appreciation of local heritage.

Borondo 7 – Flying Over Cali

This activity is carried out as part of a territorial recognition experience aimed at strengthening a sense of belonging to the city. Through the MIO Cable system, Scouts will explore representative areas of Cali's Comuna 20, following a tourist route that includes cultural and artistic exhibitions at each of the four stations: Cañavalejo, Tierra Blanca, Lleras Camargo, and Brisas de Mayo.



Calidosos– Jamboree

The Calidosos are tourism and discovery experiences that combine adventure, culture, history, and nature. Young participants will explore emblematic places across Valle del Cauca such as Cristo Rey, Hacienda El Paraíso, the Sugarcane Museum, and the MIO Cable while learning about the natural and cultural heritage of the region.

Calidoso 1 – Jamboree: Sugarcane Museum

Located on the outskirts of Cali, Hacienda Piedechinche is home to the Sugarcane Museum, a space that invites visitors to discover the history, heritage, and cultural importance of this emblematic crop in Valle del Cauca.

During the visit, participants will learn about traditional methods used to transform sugarcane into sugar, including the operation of the artisanal trapiche mill, essential for extracting cane juice. Surrounded by sugarcane fields and gardens, the museum offers an educational immersion into ancestral techniques and the evolution of Colombia's sugar industry.

Calidoso 2 – Jamboree: UVA

This vineyard and ecotourism experience in Santa Elena, Valle del Cauca, offers visitors a tour through its grape plantations. Participants take part in the grape and wine tour, which includes a talk on the history of the vineyard and the winemaking process.

They can experience grape harvesting, visit the plantations, and take photos at points of interest such as a giant wine barrel. Grape juice will be offered to all participants.

Calidoso 3 – Jamboree: Hacienda El Paraíso

Hacienda El Paraíso, located in the municipality of El Cerrito (Valle del Cauca), is an iconic site in Colombian history and literature, immortalized in Jorge Isaacs' novel María. Its mission is to preserve the cultural memory of the 19th century, allowing visitors to experience life in the traditional haciendas of the region.

The site operates as a living museum, maintaining its original architecture, period furniture, and romantic gardens that recreate the atmosphere of the novel. It also promotes cultural tourism through guided tours, educational activities, and special events.

The hacienda includes an agro-tourism component, with ecological trails, fruit trees, and green areas that enrich the experience. Its goal is to combine literary learning with a connection to nature, making it an ideal setting for reflection, artistic appreciation, and engagement with national heritage.

Calidoso 4 – Jamboree: Cali Ají

The city of Cali, internationally known as the World Capital of Salsa, is the setting for this route that connects music, history, and identity. In emblematic locations such as Barrio Obrero, Jairo Varela Square, and the Jairo Varela Museum, participants will experience salsa as intangible cultural heritage, exploring its popular origins, styles, rhythms, and key figures.

This vibrant atmosphere offers a sensory experience that blends body expression, creativity, and local pride, strengthening the bond between Scouts and the cultural richness of the region.

Calidoso 5 – Jamboree: Roots and Traditions

Cali's Historic Center is the cultural and heritage heart of the city. It holds a rich architectural, religious, and artistic legacy, with buildings that blend colonial, republican, and modern styles.

Beyond being the administrative, financial, and commercial center, this area reflects the city's historical legacy and invites participants to explore its streets, squares, and monuments that tell centuries of history and tradition.

Calidoso 6 – Flying Over Cali

This activity takes place as part of a territorial recognition experience aimed at strengthening participants' sense of belonging to the city. Using the MIO Cable system, Scouts will explore representative areas of Cali's Comuna 20, following a tourist route with cultural and artistic exhibitions at each of the four stations: Cañavalejo, Tierra Blanca, Lleras Camargo, and Brisas de Mayo.


Calidoso 7 – Jamboree: Sports Challenge

This activity takes place in the urban sports environment of Cali, recognized as the Sports Capital of the Americas. The route includes emblematic locations such as the Pascual Guerrero Olympic Stadium, the Alberto Galindo Pools, and Parque del Perro.

These settings offer a dynamic and enriching environment where participants can enjoy outdoor recreational and sports activities that foster teamwork, sports culture, and appreciation of local heritage.

Every journey is an opportunity to be inspired, to reflect, and to experience freedom from different dimensions: spirituality, creativity, art, science, and community life. In the Borondos and Calidosos, Scouts become ambassadors of respect, curiosity, and diversity—learning that freedom is not only about moving without limits, but about choosing consciously how to leave a positive mark on the places they explore.

Because exploring is also a way of serving, and every flight of the condor reminds us that the horizon is always wider when you look at it from the height of freedom.



Solidarity Block

(within the campsite)

Together, we are stronger

In this block, patrols and teams will experience activities that help them understand that true strength is not found in competing, but in cooperating; that flocks survive thanks to mutual support; and that every act of help builds a fairer, more empathetic and more human world.

From the trail to the water point, from the kitchen to construction areas, every corner of the campsite becomes a space for collaboration.

► Migration in Danger

Young people will face the challenges of a migratory flock that can only reach its destination by staying united through storms and obstacles.

► Seeds of Solidarity

The kitchen becomes a workshop of cooperation, where making jam teaches that sharing food is also sharing life.

► Water of My Village (Cam)

A symbolic mission to transport and distribute water the source of life to different well-being stations, showing that every role is essential for the common good.

► The Nest Journey (Jam)

A collaborative race where mutual care and solidarity are the only way to protect the flock.

► Bird Race

An activity that tests creativity and teamwork, reminding us that in nature, no species survives alone.

► Dive into Biodiversity

Water games inviting participants to adapt, coordinate and have fun while discovering how birds find balance between air and water.

► Cholao's Trail

A specialized orienteering activity where participants must demonstrate their map-reading and compass skills.

► Solidarity Match

Overcoming obstacles together to reach "The Great Wing Parliament," where every individual achievement contributes to a collective purpose.

Each activity becomes a living metaphor of collective flight: just like migrating birds, Scouts will learn that solidarity is not only a value, but a way of living in community recognizing oneself in others and soaring together toward a shared horizon.

Subcamp Activities

In each JamCam subcamp, participants will experience Scouting in its purest form. Through games, music and new friendships, they will find spaces to enjoy, share and create memories that will stay in their hearts forever.

Free Flight Zone

A space where participants especially young people can play, move freely and let fun take flight. They can join traditional games, take part in spontaneous tournaments, or simply relax and connect with other Scouts while enjoying the cheerful and dynamic atmosphere of the subcamp.

Game Nest

Here, participants can challenge themselves and enjoy board games, cards and mental puzzles. It is the perfect place to come with the patrol or meet new people while sharing quick rounds full of laughter, strategy and camaraderie.

Wings on Stage


A stage where participants can showcase their talent and creativity. They can sing, dance, perform or surprise the audience with something unique. This space allows them to express themselves freely, inspire others and celebrate the diversity of talents that enrich the Scout Movement.

Nest & Fire Night

A nighttime experience where everyone gathers around the fire to share stories, traditions, games and badges. It is an opportunity to strengthen bonds, learn about the customs of other countries and live the true spirit of brotherhood that characterizes Scouting.

High Altitude Party

An unforgettable celebration where participants can enjoy music, dancing and joy under the starry sky. With a live DJ, stage entertainment and rhythms from across the Americas, it will be the perfect moment to celebrate friendship, smile and move to the beat of the JamCam.



Mass Activities

Opening Ceremony

The Interamerican JamCam will open its wings with a night filled with color, music and emotion. Delegations will parade proudly carrying their national flags, marking the beginning of a ceremonial event that celebrates diversity, friendship, and the Scout spirit that unites us beyond borders.

The main show will be a journey through Colombia's most iconic festivities and traditions: folk dances, vibrant performances, ancestral rhythms and visual projections that will make everyone feel the joy of the host country.

The highlight of the evening will be the live performance of the official JamCam song, followed by a light show and a concert that will mark the beginning of an unforgettable experience for all of the Americas.

New Year's Celebration

As the calendar pauses for a moment to welcome the new year, Scouts from across the continent will share the same wish: to build a better world together. The night will be filled with music, dance and meaningful exchanges among delegations.

Before midnight, a special video will highlight the most memorable moments of the camp, followed by a countdown that will light up the Cali sky with energy, color and excitement.

The new year will be welcomed with a performance by a musical group that will get everyone singing and celebrating the brotherhood that unites us under the same American sky.

Don't forget your white outfit for this special celebration.

Closing Ceremony

The closing of the JamCam will be a gathering of emotions, memories and gratitude. Coming together once again as one family, participants will relive the best moments of the experience through images, artistic presentations and farewell messages that reflect everything learned and shared.

During the ceremony, recognitions will be given to outstanding teams and delegations, the flag of the next host country will be raised, and the event flag will be officially lowered symbolizing a story that concludes and another that begins.

The night will end with a cultural showcase and one final musical celebration that seals this gathering with the spirit of brotherhood that strengthens Scouting across the Interamerican region.






- ✓ We will be welcoming participants and assigning the EIS camping areas from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. We hope you can arrive on time so you don't miss the afternoon induction for the role you will be performing during the event. We know how important it is for you to stay informed.
- ✓ The event covers meals starting with dinner on December 26, but you will find lunch options available for purchase at Comfandi.
- ✓ During the afternoon of December 26, you will take part in a site orientation, an induction session, and the specific training for your area and assigned role, so you can feel confident and prepared throughout the event.
- ✓ In the evening, we will gather with all EIS members and adult volunteers a moment to begin our commitment, our challenge, and this great adventure together with full energy.

What should I pack for the JamCam?

Essential Items

- Neckerchief and insignia
- Comfortable footwear for outdoor activities
- Additional clothing for activities (sportswear and casual wear)
- Enough changes of clothes for your entire stay
- Complete white outfit for the New Year's Eve Celebration



Hygiene and Personal Care Items

- Complete personal hygiene kit
- Towels
- Sunscreen
- Insect repellent
- Personal medications (in original packaging with prescription if required)

Camping Gear

- Sleeping bag
- Flashlight or headlamp (with extra batteries)
- Charged power bank (remember there will be charging points only for these devices)
- Charging cable for your power bank




Equipment for Service Activities

Don't forget to pack your all-white outfit. This will be a special celebration in which all JamCam participants will dress in white to close the year together. **Get your best white look ready!**




Self-Care Recommendations

Practicing self-care will be essential to maintaining our well-being during the event. It encourages us to be aware of our own health and to remember, for example, that proper sun protection, getting enough rest, staying hydrated, and eating well will help us maintain good health and fully enjoy the wonderful experience that will be JamCam 2025.

The city of Cali has a warm climate ranging between 15°C and 28°C. On sunny days, temperatures can feel quite hot around midday and in the afternoon. During the event dates, both sunny and rainy days are expected, which also creates a favorable environment for insects. As part of your self-care, you should plan to bring sunscreen (minimum SPF 50), a hat or cap, climate-appropriate clothing, insect repellent, and a bottle or flask to stay hydrated.

It is very important that you bring the following items to practice proper self-care:

- **Sunscreen (cream) with a minimum SPF of 50**
- **Hat or cap; sunglasses (optional)**
- **Insect repellent**
- **Water bottle or flask**
- **Waterproof windbreaker jacket**




We are excited to welcome each and every one of you to this important event. We are confident that, with everyone's commitment to prevention and self-care, we will take home the best memories.

Special Needs:

As part of your self-care, do not forget to bring everything required according to your specific medical conditions. For example:

- Prescription medications, bring the original medical prescription with you and take your medication at the prescribed times.
- Sleep apnea respiratory support equipment (CPAP). If you use a CPAP machine, include a 10-meter extension cord with your equipment. Colombia operates on 110–120 V AC with a two-prong plug plus grounding pin.



- Medical guidance, Consult your treating physician regarding any items that may be difficult to bring to the event. Your doctor can advise whether temporary suspension of use is possible during your stay. If you have any particular questions or concerns, please raise them through your delegation leader.

Safe from Harm

Learning Pathway

At JamCam, **all adults** (EIS members, the organizing team, providers, and all other participants) commit to care and self-care measures that allow us to build safe environments. To support this, we have the **Safe from Harm Learning** Pathway, which prepares you for JamCam 2025 and for following the JamCam 2025 **Code of Conduct** Americas United for Peace.

You can access this learning pathway through the **link provided** or by **visiting the Safe from Harm section on the JamCam website**. To complete it, you must finish three online courses.

The learning pathway allows us to understand Safe from Harm within this type of event, as well as the specific procedures established for the Interamerican Scout JamCam, along with key aspects of Colombian legislation and culture.

Remember! This certificate is mandatory for entering the event.



Code of Conduct

Every JamCam participant must be familiar with the JamCam 2025 **Code of Conduct** Americas United for Peace. This document outlines the **guidelines for coexistence** that help keep everyone safe during the event and identifies behaviors that violate Colombian law as well as the Scout Promise and Law.



Incident Reporting Form

To report incidents during the event, you can use the **form available in the SISCOOUT App**. Log in to your profile and go to the **“Need help? Safe from Harm”** section. Then select **JAMCAM COLOMBIA 2025** and complete the required information.



Cholao Reminds You

Prepare your friendship bracelets before arriving!

One of the most meaningful traditions of international camps is the exchange of **friendship bracelets**. Cholao, our official mascot, encourages you to bring your bracelets already prepared from home so you can exchange them with Scouts from across the Americas.



Recomendaciones:

- Create several bracelets before the event (the more you bring, the more friendships you can forge).
- Use the colors of your country or the colors that best represent you.
- Include elements that reflect your culture or region.
- Make sure they are well finished and durable.
- Consider creating a variety of designs for different exchanges.



Remember: Every bracelet you exchange becomes a bond of friendship that transcends borders. Let your hands create the ties that will unite the Americas.

Solid waste management protocol JamCam 2025



In accordance with **Resolution 2184 of 2019** issued by the **Ministry of Environment and Sustainable Development**, JamCam will implement a three-category solid waste separation system, each identified by a specific color. These categories are: **Organic Recoverable Waste** (green), **Recyclable Waste** (white), and **Non-Recoverable Waste** (black).

The following image shows an example of the color-coding system used for waste separation.

Sources of Waste Generation

Based on the classification of solid waste, the potential sources of origin are identified. These include:

Source waste separation

All participants attending JamCam 2025 must carry out source separation of solid waste by using the ecological stations properly and disposing of materials in the appropriate bin.

Below is an example of the ecological stations that will be installed in strategic areas throughout the camp.

Recolección y almacenamiento temporal de residuos sólidos

The collection of bags from each ecological station will be carried out by the park's assigned Comfandi staff. They will follow the established route and place the bags in the temporary storage area designated within the park's facilities.

Pesaje residuos sólidos

The different types of collected waste will be weighed daily to obtain accurate data and determine the total amount of waste generated each day and throughout the entire event.



It will be supported by Comfandi's logistics team.
